4th Ghana Giving Summit Synopsis

Philanthropy Ghana's annual Ghana Giving Summit has established itself as a preeminent catalyst for meaningful dialogue, collaboration, and strategizing to advance the philanthropic sector in Ghana and drive positive societal impact.

This year's 4th Ghana Giving Summit is no exception. Centering on the theme "Activating Radical-Local Philanthropy for the Attainment of the SDGs", the Summit aims to ignite insightful conversations on the power of giving and the significant progress being made towards the achievements of the SDGs.

The Summit will feature three dynamic segments of engagement.

The plenary session:

A session to engage all participants, speakers, and invited guests to delve into thought-provoking discussions on innovative strategies for enhancing local philanthropic efforts.

This segment will include a **Panel Discussion** with distinguished philanthropists, policymakers, and thought leaders on leveraging strategic initiatives and impactful partnerships to drive significant progress towards achieving the SDGs.



The Plenary session will also highlight the **Lightning Talks** of solidarity messages from seasoned stakeholders within the Philanthropic ecosystems.

17 Rooms Exercise:

A highly interactive and engaging session to provide participants an opportunity to break out into 5 working groups 'rooms' on the 5 thematic pillars of the SDGs; **Prosperity, People, Peace, Partnership and Planet.**

17 Rooms is a new approach to spurring actions for the SDGs that are *big enough to matter but sized right to get done*. Participants of each RoundRoom will explore and advance actionable next steps relating to the SDGs. Action ideas are then shared to spot opportunities for cooperation that bubble up across Rooms.

Self-Arranged Sessions:

To provide a more personalised and targeted exploration of varying philanthropic topics, this segment allows for participants to select a subsession they have high interest in to engage with like-minded peers.

Topics for this segment are; Media in Philanthropy and Climate Philanthropy. The Self-Arranged Sessions create an opportune environment for networking and collaborations within specific interests and initiatives.

The Summit will emphasise on the cultivation of impactful partnerships, and the discovery of pioneering models, with an overarching aim of activating local resource mobilisation for strategic philanthropy.
